Survey: Ga. Meth Project Alerting Teens on Dangers

ATLANTA - A study of the Georgia Meth Project shows teens and young adults are now less likely to try methamphetamine, Governor Nathan Deal and other officials said Tuesday. The results of the survey were announced at the Georgia State Capitol.

According to the survey, 52 percent of Georgia teens now see a "great risk" in trying methamphetamine once or twice. That figure is up over 10 points according to a study prior to the launch of the project last year.

The survey shows that an increased number of teens have told their friends not to use the drug. It also shows an

increase in the number of teens who have discussed the subject of methamphetamine with their parents -- 42 percent compared to 35 percent in 2010.

The 2011 survey was conducted from February to April.
